What Does the CMD-UUWF Board of Directors Do???

Their first responsibility is to sponsor conferences and to see that they have seed money for operations. Finding the leadership for these conferences is also important. They account for and manage the dues and other income and use them carefully.

Another major job is to see that the VOW newsletter is written, edited, and mailed to members and key UU women. We owe a great debt to those who help with this vital work and want to thank all the editors and mailers through out the years.

Mileage to the Board meetings is paid at 20 cents a mile and phone calls and postage spent by members of the Board are reimbursed. Most positions on the Board require two to four hours a month at home and Board members are expected to attend at least two out of the three yearly Board meetings. Board Meetings are spaced within the District to give local members and Board members a chance to exchange ideas. VOW postage and printing, small charitable contributions, an allowance for the President to go to UUWF Biennial, Allerton scholarships, and miscellaneous administrative expenses are all budgeted. Profits and losses from our two conferences generally balance out over the year.

If you are asked to serve on the Board we hope you will be able and willing to serve. In any case be kind to the Nominating Committee members who might talk to you. They do not always have an easy job and need som TLC.




Remember - these stories can be happy, sad, humorous, serious, fact, fiction, myth, the choice is yours. The evening is ours.

Pacific Southwest

Catherine Eels, President of Pacific Southwest District, shared their programming details with us. They have 1 week-end conference every eighteen months and 2 or 3 day-only meetings. They call their conference committee the Creation Crew. "Empowerment" is probably the core theme that attracts a wide variety of people. In my mind it is also closely associated with women's spirituality as we weave in worship and ritual. "During the past two day gatherings, we have also sponsored a boutique to earn scholarship funds. We currently have \$1,000 in our scholarship fund for our next week-end conference." How could we use this idea? We will try to find out.

Vermont-New Hampshire

Katherine Winthrop of the Vermont-New Hampshire District attended the Womenspirit conference (sponsored by Women and Religion CMD). "We came back fired up to have the UUWF the main group through which programming and communication flowed, and to restore the W & R to its original mandate; to be a watchdog on sexism within the district. We are now in the process (a gradual one) of bringing the two groups together."

Massachusettes Bay

Massachusettes Bay District has at present no District UUWF structure but the Women and Religion group has sponsored a conference on Women and Violence.

The highlight of the weekend was the inspiring address by Rev. Dr. Rebecca Parker, President of Starr King. Workshops were conducted on the conference theme that ranged from personal empowerment, visual arts in worship, the sacredness of wild places on our earth, an overview of the new curriculum "Rise Up and Call Her Name," the Wiccan Wheel of the Year, music & ritual in goddess-based celebrations, sacredness in community action, and identifying "coming out" differently as being in the realm of the spiritual.

The weekend ended with a Sharing Circle of story-telling, music, poetry, and inspired with ways of worship, and determined to meet again for Womenspirit '93 in Madison, WI next January.

HESTER HUFF ROLE OF RECOGNITION

Information

The Central Midwest District Unitarian Universlist Women's Federation wishes to recognize an outstanding Unitarian Universalist lay woman for service in the Central Midwest District. To this end we establish the Hester Huff Role of Recognition.

Nonimations

Nominations may be made by individuals or UUWF units. These nominations throughout the year must be made in writing by May 15.

Committee

The current nominating committee making the final seclection will be composed of the three most recent Hester Huff recipients. The Chair shall be the longest standing member of this Hester Huff nominating committee. The present CMD-UUWF Board members are exempt from this committee, but are responsible to find a replacement to act on the committee if a vacancy occurs. The award may not be given to any women currently serving on the selection committee or current CMD-UUWF Board members.

Job Description

The committee will solicit nominations from Central Midwest women's groups and individual Unitarian Universalist women. They will provide a nomination form. Each woman who is nominated will receive a letter of recognition from the committee prior to the Allerton conference. If the nominating committee choses, they may notify the winner before the Allerton conference. A letter will be sent by the committee to invite past Hester Huff recipients to the Allerton Conference.

Award

The recipient's name will be engraved on the Hester Huff Role of Recognition plaque, the last recipient will have the new winners name engraved. This plaque will remain in the recipient's possession for one year.

The recipient will also be given a certificate of recognition made by nominating committee. The presentation will be made annually at the the nominating committee. Allerton Conference.

A letter of congratulations will be sent to the Board of Trustees of the recipient's society, by the nominating committee.

The committee keeps the H. H. sashes and sees they are at Allerton

each year.

The Allerton Planning Committee appoints a group to be in charge of the reception or may chose to do it themselves, including table cloth, decorations, food, drinks and winners coursage (optional).
