Geri is an author and artist. Her passion for the Native American lives that were disregarded, lost in the creation of this country, is deep and strong. Their tears were as salty and wet as yours and mine. They loved their children and the land; many lost both, their loved ones and the land beneath their feet.

Geri's keynote will describe how as her artistic voice developed, she allowed her intuition and dreams to lead her down an unlikely path from court reporter to watercolor artist inspired by ancient petroglyph and pictograph sites around the world. Most recently this journey led her to co-author <u>Hidden Thunder: Rock Art of the Upper Midwest</u> published by the Wisconsin Historical Society Press. Her keynote will take you on a journey to the rock art sites and experiences contained in <u>Hidden Thunder</u> and beyond, plus some early dreams and visions along this 25-year path that I've never shared before.

Ultimately Geri's work is about connecting with our inner self, each other and Mother Earth. Never has it been more essential that we all learn our own unique way to do this: calm down, tune in and find your own best path forward.

Geri will also provide a workshop, **Painting Turtles for Mother Earth**. This painting workshop will be a group prayer, all participants creating their own paintings, yet each focused on the healing of Mother Earth. As a symbol to unify us in this painting prayer, we will focus on Turtle as an ancient earth resident, a symbol from the waters, a symbol of Mother Earth.


