Good Strides in Difficult Times

I am pleased to report on the good strides made in 2008. It feels hopeful that the UU Women's Connection continues to thrive in this historic year of change and economic hard times. It feels hopeful when liberal religious women gather as we do here in the Central Midwest District. I'm glad to have been a part of the UU Women's Connection council, which allowed me a front row seat on all the activity.

For me 2008 was a year that often felt like Council bit off more than we could chew. But in the end we pulled it off. We provided three retreats, and we worked with the Women & Religion committee (W&R) to train-the-trainers (T3) for the *Cakes for the Queen of Heaven* curriculum. It's exciting to have a new feminist curriculum and to work with W&R. Now those trainers are out in their own communities facilitating workshops. Look for our ongoing projects with W&R such as *Cakes* at the 2009 District Assembly and possible retreat offerings. Financially, much of the seed money the Connection granted *Cakes* planners will be returned to use in future projects. I am proud to say that other districts have contacted us to learn about our *Cakes* training programs.

The Connection was able to fund a \$500 grant this year to Debby Gaines for her work on a GLBT retreat called *Amazons Awakening*. Find her report on page three.

Vital first-time attendee incentive grants continued to be awarded for retreats this year, as well as the needs based and student minister scholarships and childcare incentive grants. We continue our annual gifts to worthy causes. (See the 2009 budget on page three.)

Our councilors continued offering Margaret Fuller Conversations. Thank you to those churches that so graciously hosted us. I enjoyed meeting different women's groups to find out what matters to them. The Connection offers a good service in re-energizing local women's groups. I wish groups well who spoke of a desire to breathe new life and new diversity into their existing women's groups.

We purchased the video *Ironed Jawed Angels* (the HBO production about Alice Paul and the American suffragette movement) to make it available to members. Don't forget to invite the Connection council to speak or show a movie at your women's group if you're looking for programming. Speaking of media, look for the Fall Retreat panel discussion "What Women Want" to appear on local cable access channels. Great UU public relations!

Thank you to the women of this district and especially fellow councilors for your gifts, donations, time, talents, vision, compassion and membership. A special thank you goes out to those who hosted retreats and contributed to scholarship funds or gave in kind donations. Thanks to council members who put together the Allerton and Lake Geneva events and to the Joliet church for hosting Spring Conference. Review of 2008 Goals

2008 was a BIG year for the UU Women's Connection including a return to Allerton for a 50th Anniversary celebration, completion of a two year project with CMwD Women and Religion Committee (W&R) introducing Rev. Shirley Ranck's outstanding feminist curriculum rewrite of the popular *Cakes for the Queen of Heaven*, \$500 grant to GLBT Spirals in Motion retreat planner, Debby Gaines, and our usual Spring and Fall Retreats, annual gift giving, scholarships, and incentives. Worthy of mention also are the Salon programs provided by Council at congregations who have granted us meeting space for quarterly meetings. (Urbana-Champaign and Hinsdale, Illinois congregations, most recently.) The 2008 Annual Meeting and Council Retreat were held at Seven Circles Heritage Center in Edwards, Illinois.

Other important organizational goals this year were to increase leadership, church liaisons and encourage membership through incentives such as the "8 for \$8 in 2008" offered to formed and forming units in the district, and final selection of a UU Women's Connection logo. (Note the selected logo on page one of this newsletter.)

Plans are afoot to use newly recruited data base coordinator, Vi Lanum of Springfield, Illinois, to assist with a secure online member data base and other online projects this year.



What Else is New for 2009? Goals for the coming year include:

- Recruitment of up to nine councilors as allowed by UU Women's Connection bylaws,
- Look at smaller conferences, with lower fees, sliding scales and alternative ways of approach to payment and planning,
- Consideration of traveling workshops prepared for local congregations and working as a clearing house for "out-of-the-box" programming offered by many local congregations,
- Continued membership incentive programs and
- Possible spring musical mini fest themed "Singing the Journey"
