Goodbye George Williams Retreat Center

This year, the 27th year at the Lake Geneva George Williams College/Aurora University Retreat Center at Williams Bay, Wisconsin, 2009 fall retreat participants will bid farewell to the retreat center location. The focus and goals of George Williams have been changing for several years effecting not only the UU Women's Connection, but also many other groups who have used the center over the years.

Retreats will continue during the spring and summer months, but the board at George Williams/Aurora University will discontinue "off season" retreats that traditionally have been scheduled after the end of October. This "off season" rate has enabled the Connection and our predecessor, CMwD-UUWF, to keep the costs reasonable and accessible to many women. So it is with a heavy heart that the decision to leave the retreat center at the end of the 27th year is made. The Connection Council is looking for an alternate location and will have news about that soon. "It is what it is"... and we must move on.

A Brief Fall Retreat History: In November 5-7, 1982 the women of the Rockford, Illinois Congregation's Alliance Women's group began the fall conference featuring Carolyn McDade. The only workshop, "Choosing Wellness" was conducted by Rosalie Knutson and Norma Anerberg-Freeberg.

Over the many years at the Williams Bay location on Lake Geneva retreat themes have spoken to the times and the changes in the lives of women since 1982. Some theme titles are: "Women for all Seasons", "Women in Transition...Women on Retreat", "Women's Web", "Women and Wisdom, Coming of Age", "Empowerment: Women as Agents of Change." "A Circle of Women Joined", "Women For All Seasons "Women's Voices", "Women's Spiritual Journey: Mother, Maiden, Crone." AND those were only the themes with the word "women" in the title.

In other years' theme titles were: "Searching, Sharing, Soaring", "Let Your Spirits Soar", "Renewal", "The Goddess Within You." "We Laugh, We Cry, We Live, We Die, We Dance, We Sing Our Songs", "Under One Sky—Cosmic Theology", "Sisters on a Journey: Remembering the Future", "Intuitive Living in the FEMillenium" "The Sacred Within" "Celebrating the Goddess: "Sources of Wisdom", "Creating Joy", "My Body: Live, Love, Laugh", "Feel the Rhythm", "Peace of Cake." 2009 theme, "It is what it is...healing in hard times." is planned by the women of Unity Temple UU Congregation of Oak Park Illinois. Mary Ann Macklin, Patricia Monaghan, Rev. Jacquie Meli, Wendy Selene, Meg Barnhouse, Judy Piazza and Nancy Vedder-Shults. In 2009 we will welcome Rev. Rebecca Armstrong.

Thank you to women's groups over the years that have planned the Lake Geneva Fall Retreat. Thanks also to many Connection Council and UUWF Board members who recruited planners and assisted in every year of planning for 27 years.

The 1986 fall retreat information is missing but was deemed "a dream come true with over 100 women in attendance" in the 1987 Winter VOW; no further information is available about the retreat. *
